Graffiti and maintenance standards of equipment

Over recent weeks we have had an increasing number of complaints regarding graffiti and cleanliness of equipment. We realise the industry is under significant pressure and strain, in these extraordinary times this is just a gentle reminder of maintenance standard requirements under CoPTTM.

Rotating beacons over use

It has been noticed of late that a lot of vehicles are travelling in between work sites with rotating beacons operating. This detracts from the use of rotating beacons when actually working. As per CoPTTM rotating beacons are only to be used while within a work site or prior to reaching a speed similar to other vehicles on the road. Once a vehicle has left the work area beacons need to be switched off to prevent motorists and the public becoming immune to their use and therefore lessening their impact when required.

Notification of Changes to TMPs onsite

We realise that everyone is busy and worksite conditions change due to unforeseen circumstances. A reminder to all contractors that under CoPTTM significant changes made to TMPs onsite must be notified to the RCA. The best way for notification to be made is via email to the TMC mailbox. This way there is an electronic record of the event and if any issues arise a TMC can get in contact.
