## Christchurch Marathon Sunday 5 June 2016 - Roadwork Restrictions

Please be aware that this high-profile event is proposed to occur on Sunday 5 June 2016 (subject to public submission process), and road space along the route would need to be maximised for the safety of participants and road users.

- 1. Contractors with accepted worksites may be asked to reduce the impact or remove the site for the day a TMC will contact you should this be required.
- 2. Works utilising Service Agreements or Generic Plans within the CBD (Four Avenues Area) and the Eastern area highlighted on the map are not permitted on this day unless specific approval has been obtained.
- 3. Work activities may be permitted on a case-by-case basis. Please contact a TMC to discuss.

Operations on non-highlighted routes are not affected by the above.

# Keeping Christchurch Moving

Christchurch Airport Marathon Sunday 5th June 2016

PROPOSED ROUTE SUBMISSION NOTIFICATION

Here is the proposed Christchurch Airport Marathon Course with the proposed traffic impacts that will be in place on Sunday 5th June 6.00am - 2.00pm.

The roads the marathon will take place on will be closed to traffic and roads crossing the route will be closed or heavily restricted during this time.

### What's different this year?

- Route has been changed to retain access to the hospital.
- Traffic will be diverted onto alternative roads rather than attempting to cross the marathon route.
- Montreal and Durham Streets will be open from 10am.
- An operations centre including emergency services, event and traffic operations will be established.
- Start time has been moved 30 minutes earlier to reduce impacts on peak traffic later in the day.
- Enhanced communications and signage will be implemented.

#### **Proposed Traffic impacts:**

#### CBD 6:00am - 10:00am

- All north-south CBD routes will be restricted by the marathon route, and detours will direct traffic onto Deans Ave.
- An extra 10-20mins will be required to cross the CBD.
- This will include delays along the detour route Deans Ave.


## CBD 10:00am - 2:00pm

- Montreal Street and Durham Street will be open, and detours will be changed to direct traffic onto these routes.
- Along these routes, traffic should allow an extra 30-40mins between 11:00am-2:00pm.

#### Eastern Suburbs 6:00am - 2:00pm.

- Controlled crossing points will be in place at two key Avon River bridges Stanmore Rd and Gayhurst Rd.
- Traffic is recommended to allow an extra 10 to 20 minutes to cross the route at these points between 9:00am and 2:00pm.
- The Avondale Bridge will be closed and traffic will be detoured onto SH74 ANZAC Drive which is also a bypass east of the route.

These closures are proposed to be made under paragraph 11(e) of the Tenth Schedule of the Local Government Act 1974. The proposed closures will apply to all vehicular traffic with the exception of emergency service vehicles.
