TTM Restrictions: 20 – 23 February 2017

Major events are being held in Christchurch on 21 and 22 February 2017 at AMI Stadium and within the Christchurch CBD, and are expected to place pressure on strategic transport routes and roads surrounding venues. TTM activities therefore need to be restricted on certain roads to minimise disruption to network operation and to maximise access and parking around the events.

Please refer to the maps attached for roads effected by restrictions

Programme Managers, Project Planners and STMS's: Please ensure that all works causing restrictions on traffic flow, public car-parking, and pedestrian access on the highlighted roads, are completed and Temporary Traffic Management is uplifted from the roads wherever practicable by 4:00pm Monday 20 February 2017.

Activities that do not impact on traffic flow, public car-parking, or pedestrian access are not restricted, and normal traffic management may recommence on these roads from 12:01am on Thursday 23 February.

In recognition of the intense programme of rebuild works continuing in Christchurch, TMPs that enable works of strategic importance will be considered on an exception basis during this period. Contact must be made with a TMC to discuss project details prior to 5:00pm on Friday 3 February 2017 or worksites will need to removed by 4:00pm Monday 20 February 2017.
